Its action is based on the 10 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) centered on the human being.




Strategic Plan 2018-2020

The Government of Monaco's **Official Development Assistance (ODA),**provided exclusively in the form of grants
or technical assistance, represents just over **1% of government revenue.**For the period 2018-2020, the key features
of the strategic plan are:

- Focus on 11 countries including 7 Least Developed Countries (LDCs).
- 4 areas of intervention: health, food security, socio-economic integration
 & education
- 6 flagship programmes: the fight against sickle cell disease, malaria control, support for vulnerable children, support for civil protection, child nutrition and job creation
- Increase in ODA to reach 21 €m in 2020 (54.5 €m over the three-year period)
- 30% of ODA directly allocated to stakeholders in the South
- 70% of ODA allocated to LDCs, with priority given to the Sahel
- Assistance granted largely to Civil Society
- Enhanced emergency humanitarian aid and support for refugees


Launch of the Strategic Plan 2018-2020

Areas of intervention: 2018 / 2020 trends

The Monegasque Cooperation focuses on 4 main areas of intervention, in accordance with the national policies of the countries concerned:

Other: civil protection, study grants and training, raise awareness about development

HEALTH:

- fight against pandemics and neglected diseases
- improve maternal and child health
- support to national health systems and access to medical care

FOOD SECURITY:

- nutrition
- food production and agricultural sectors

SOCIO-ECONOMIC INTEGRATION:

- assistance to and social inclusion of vulnerable populations
- social entrepreneurship and local economic development

EDUCATION:


- access to education and literacy
- support to vocational training



Flagship programmes

In order to strengthen the impact of its ODA, the Monegasque Cooperation focuses on **flagship programmes:** multi-country, multi-sector and multi-partner, which constitute privileged niches of intervention.

Over the 2018-2020 period, priority is given to **six flagship programmes** having a high impact on the population.



Flagship programmes

Health

Malaria control

Malaria kills 1 person every 2 minutes. Burkina Faso, Niger and Mali account for 18% of all deaths due to malaria in the world.

The fight against sickle cell disease

Globally, there are 50 million carriers of sickle cell disease, the most common genetic disease in the world. Without the proper treatment, 1 in 2 children with the disease will die before the age of 5.





Food security


Child nutrition

Malnutrition affects 50% of children in Niger, Madagascar and Burundi. Support during the first thousand days of the child's life prevents irreversible consequences on his/her growth and health.

Socio-economic integration

Job creation

Youth unemployment rates have reached 36% in Tunisia and 57% in South Africa. Helping to create decent jobs and supporting African SMEs will contribute to the economic and social development of developing countries.





Education I socioeconomic integration

Support for vulnerable and street children

Children's rights, children's care, social support, medical support, psychological support, academic support and vocational integration: 1 dollar invested equates to 7 dollars in social impact.



Other areas

Support for Civil Protection

Enhancing prevention measures for the protection of civilian populations in the event of disasters with the technical assistance of the Monaco Fire Brigade in Burkina Faso, Mauritania and Mali.

Emergency humanitarian aid

Guided by the basic principles of International Humanitarian Law which are humanity, impartiality, neutrality and independence, Monaco responds to emergency appeals made by multilateral and bilateral partners during humanitarian crises caused by natural disasters, conflict or the consequences of climate change.

2.5 M€ allocated over the 2018-2020 period, with a focus on food aid, natural disasters and refugees




Partners

 Cardio-Thoracic Centre

It is also a partner of **SADEV**, a Monegasque development assistance corporation created in 2015, directed towards impact investing.







Monaco Collectif Humanitaire

The Office of International Cooperation manages the Monaco Collectif Humanitaire **solidarity chain** project, the purpose of which is to perform surgery in Monaco on children whose cardiac pathology cannot be treated in their countries of origin.

The hospital partnership

The aim of the hospital partnership is to **strengthen competence** and develop training for doctors and medical staff from the Monegasque Cooperation's partner countries: medical teams from Monaco dispatched abroad or training provided to medical staff in the Principality in **specific specialities** — cardiology, orthopaedics, gynaecology — twenty or so times a year.



International Solidarity Organisations in Monaco

Partnerships with International Solidarity Organisations (ISO) in Monaco are established on the **co-financing** of projects, **capacity building** and the **creation of a platform** bringing together all Monegasque organisations.

Raising awareness about development



The Office of International Cooperation works to raise the awareness of multiple audiences about development issues (children, students, Monegasque administration...) through various means and supports:

- Partnerships with higher education institutions (Bioforce Institute, University of Aix-Marseille, Sciences Po...) and in schools of partner countries
- The short films' festival "Le Temps Presse" (No Time Left) on the Sustainable Development Goals
- Awareness raising activities at schools in Monaco

The International Volunteer Programme

- The International Volunteer Programme of Monaco (VIM) was created in 2007 to:
 - offer young adults the opportunity to gain professional experience in international solidarity abroad;
 - help strengthen the actions implemented on the ground in cooperation with local partners.

Every year, a dozen VIMs are posted with partners supported by the Monegasque Cooperation (missions lasting from 1-3 years)

The Team

Under the umbrella of the Government of Monaco's **Ministry of External Relations and Cooperation**, the Office of International Cooperation comprises:

- 16 people at its headquarters, including
 8 Programme Managers assigned to specific countries;
- 7 Country Coordinators posted to Consulates of Monaco (Burkina Faso Madagascar, Mali, Morocco, Niger, Senegal and Tunisia).

The Monegasque Cooperation also benefits from the active presence of **11 Consuls** representing the Principality in partner countries.




Overview of the strategic plan 2015-2017



The implementation of the 2015-2017 strategic plan was facilitated by a regular increase in ODA over the 3-year period.

- 37 M€ of ODA
- 1.02% of government revenue
- 400 projects
- 800,000 direct beneficiaries
 (including 80,000 refugees) and several million indirect beneficiaries
- Less than 9% of operating expenses
- 1,765,000 € allocated by the Government of Monaco to respond to 35 emergency appeals
